

M.A in Clinical Mental Health Counseling with a concentration in General Counseling

Degree: M.A.

This degree map is based on the 2023-24 Academic Catalog and is subject to change. Students should meet with their academic advisor each semester and use Degree Works to monitor their individual progress toward degree completion. The concentration is comprised of 3 courses (9 credits) that are part of the overall 60-credit requirement for degree completion, however, they are focused on the specialty area. The CMHC program is a year-round program, thus students should prepare to take courses in Fall, Spring, and summer semesters. Winter classes are available, but these are optional and, in most cases, do not count towards the 60-credit requirement. A student who chooses this concentration will receive specific training surrounding trauma as well as an introduction into working with both military veterans and their families and children and adolescents and how to best support them in a variety of mental health settings. Students who choose the general concentration track will be able to choose between the two military veteran courses during their first summer semester and between the two child and adolescent courses during their second summer semester.
