COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

Denise L. Dieter, Esquire

Lycoming County Magisterial District Judge

enise L. Dieter was elected to the position of Lycoming County Magisterial District Judge in 2021, based on her substantial legal experience and community reputation.

Dieter earned her Bachelor of Arts degree from Mansfield University and her Juris Doctor from Widener University School of Law. At Mansfield, she was the Outstanding Criminal Justice Senior, Class of 1990, earned the Act 101 Motivation Award, was a member of the Phi Sigma Pi Honor Fraternity, and of the field hockey team from 1986 to 1987, and served as president of the Criminal Justice Club.

As a Magisterial District Judge, her duties include issuing warrants for arrest and search and emergency protection orders. Dieter presides over criminal preliminary arraignments to set bail; presides over and adjudicates summary criminal trials; presides over and adjudicates criminal preliminary hearings; presides over and adjudicates certain civil matters; presides over and adjudicates landlord-tenant disputes; presides over and adjudicates truancy hearings and performs weddings.

Dieter created the first "Juvenile Diversionary Program" in a Magisterial District Judge's office in Lycoming County. She also collaborated with the Jersey Shore Area School District to launch the firstever Attendance Improvement Court at the Jersey Shore High School. In 2016, she established an annual scholarship for a Jersey Shore High School senior who will attend CU-Mansfield University. To date, the scholarship awards have exceeded \$6,000. She is also a member of the Lycoming County Autism Task Force.

Before she was elected a judge, Dieter was retained out of law school to join a growing general practice law firm with a concentration in municipal, estate, and social security disability law and litigation; contributing to doubling of business within 10 years. In 2014, she was the first attorney in Lycoming County to present a case under the Adult Protective Services Act and is a member of the Lycoming County Elder Abuse Task Force. Dieter handled multi-municipality regionalization for two sewage treatment plants from start to finish, including overseeing plant construction, facilitating Penn Vest loans, drafting and implementing industrial-user pretreatment plans, obtaining permits, and



assuring EPA and DEP compliance.

She also advised and facilitated the regionalization of the Tiadaghton Valley Regional Police Department, including managing union, pension, and funding and budgeting issues, and assuring state regulatory compliance.

Dieter was selected to teach other lawyers and paralegals through the Pennsylvania Bar Association and Temple University School of Law. She has also conducted seminars to educate and assist hundreds of individuals with powers of attorney and guardianship issues.

In 1993, Dieter was appointed Solicitor to Lycoming and Clinton County Office of Aging with exclusive authority to employ the Older Adults Protective Services Act to protect seniors from risk of harm or death.

In the community, Dieter is a member of the Jersey Shore YMCA Board (Past President), Jersey Shore Hospital Board, Jersey Shore Historical Committee, Jersey Shore Business and Professional Women's Association, a lifetime member of the National Rifle Association, a Rescue Road Warriors Emergency Animal Transporter, Big Brothers — Big Sisters and serves as a Little League Coach.

ansfield University dates to 1857 when the Mansfield Classical Seminary opened with 105 students. In 1862, the institution was designated a State Normal School for the training of teachers.

Enrollment had grown to 400 by 1905. In 1927, Mansfield became the first school in Pennsylvania to be designated a State Teachers College, authorized by the State Board of Education to grant bachelor of science degrees in elementary and secondary education, music, and home economics. In 1960, the school became Mansfield State College, a multi-purpose institution offering a broad range of curricula. On July 1, 1983, Mansfield University became a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education. In an effort to expand high-quality, affordable academic opportunities to support the needs of all learners,

Mansfield integrated with Bloomsburg and Lock Haven universities to form Commonwealth University of Pennsylvania in 2022.
