### The University Receives Funding for Transfer Initiative

 Commonwealth U was selected as one of nine recipients nationwide for a catalyst grant by the National Association of System Heads (NASH). The "Earn What you have Earned" initiative undertook a transcript audit of all transfer students to ensure they were awarded credit they had earned through the application of the newly revised PASSHE Student Transfer Policy.



### Students and Faculty Return from Service Trip to Rural Jamaica

- Lock Haven faculty led a short-term servicelearning program to Jamaica, and for the first time, were joined by Bloomsburg students. This service trip takes place in the rural mountainous village of Harmons in south central Jamaica.
- Two faculty, Dr. Jennifer Bell (physician assistant studies) and Dr. Amy Way (health science) were accompanied by 22 undergraduate and graduate students from Bloomsburg and Lock Haven and Clearfield.



# College of Education and Human Services Receives National Recognition

 The College of Education and Human Studies at Bloomsburg, received national recognition from the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP) when it was named a recipient of the Frank Murray Leadership Recognition for Continuous Improvement.



#### Mansfield Students and Alumni Concert Choirs Perform at Carnegie Hall in honor of MLK

- 53 students in the Mansfield Concert Choir, along with 55 Concert Choir alumni, performed at the renowned Carnegie Hall in New York City on Jan. 15 in celebration of Dr. Martin Luther King.
- The Mansfield students and alumni performed alongside five high school choirs, four of which are directed by MU alumni.







# Dining and Housing Rate Proposal

- Proposal to increase dining plans and residential hall rates by 2.5%.
- The increase does not take into consideration the full impact of inflation.
- The campuses will need to cover any losses with auxiliary reserves.

- Maximum residential hall increase is \$116 per semester at Bloomsburg.
- Maximum dining plan increase is \$51 per semester at Mansfield.

# Student Fees Proposal

- Proposal to set student fees at \$1,650 per semester.
- Student fee rate alignment and standardization across the University.
- Full-time, in-state, undergraduate students represent the largest student population.
- Academic enhancement and technology fee will continue to be calculated as a percent of tuition.
- Graduate, out of state, international, and online only student fees will be derived from the fees established above.
- Simplify the student account bill and provide standardized definitions across the University.
