- Emily Shaffer, a senior theatre arts major at CU-Bloomsburg, will soon spend a week in Washington, D.C. at the Kennedy Center American College Theatre Arts Festival's (KCACTF) National Festival.
- Shaffer earned this opportunity by winning the ASPIRE Arts Leadership Finalist award to represent KCACTF's Region 2, becoming the first CU-Bloomsburg student ever to do so.

- The focus of the week was on cooperative programs with the schools and mission in Harmons and collaborating with the Jamaican Ministry of Health.
- CU students from Bloomsburg, Clearfield and Lock Haven participated in the program.

- More than 800 students tackled nearly 175 job sites across the Town of Bloomsburg, volunteering to perform spring cleaning tasks for our neighbors.
- The single-day community service event, now in its 16th year, is sponsored by the Community Government Association.





National History Day at CU-Lock Haven

- CU-Lock Haven hosted the National History Day (NHD) contest for Region 5 for students in grades 6 through 12.
- 58 students participated in this year's contest from 11 middle and high schools.
- Region 5 National History Day is part of the National History Day program for middle and high school students and is a yearlong academic program proven to enhance student achievement and college and career readiness.



21st annual Kent's Fest

- CU-Lock Haven's Council of Exceptional Children student group hosted the 21st annual Kent's Fest Celebration on April 11.
- This musical talent show for children and adults with disabilities brought together area schools in a heartwarming celebration of creativity, unity and inclusion.
- Approximately 500 students in grades kindergarten through 12 participated, with more than 550 attendees coming to watch the performances throughout the day.
