10th Anniversary of Lock Haven's ALL IN DAY OF GIVING Shatters Records

The Lock Haven University Foundation's 10th anniversary All In Day of Giving on April 10-11, 2025 was one for the record books, with **more than \$273,000 raised and over 1,300 donors rallying together** in a powerful demonstration of Haven pride—surpassing 2024's milestone mark of just over \$253,000 raised, and eclipsing 1,000 donors for the first time in All-In history.

More than 30 matching gift challenges sponsored by donors were unlocked throughout the 24-hour fundraiser, including multiple "POWER HOURS," first-time donor, young-alumni, athletics-specific giving challenges, and more.

Since its inception in 2015, All In has **generated more than \$1.6 million** in support of Lock Haven students. Mark your calendar **for April 16-17, 2026**, and prepare to make next year's All In celebration our best All In yet.

PAULA “SANDY” BELL

A Champion for Women’s Wrestling

Inspired by the story of Lock Haven All-American women’s wrestler, Lily Sherer, **Professor Emerita Paula “Sandy” Bell** established the **W. Max Bossert Jr. and Paula F. Bell Women’s Wrestling Scholarship**—one of The Haven’s first scholarships dedicated solely to women’s wrestling. A trailblazer in technology and longtime advocate for students, Bell’s gift ensures future generations of women wrestlers have the resources to rise, lead, and succeed.

MIKE NAUMAN ‘80

An Investment in Shaping Wrestlers’ Lives

Former Bald Eagle standout **Mike Nauman ‘80** credits wrestling and legendary coach Dr. Kenneth Cox for helping shape his life. With a steadfast belief in current head wrestling coach Scott Moore’s ability to do the same for current student-athletes, Nauman is ensuring the legacy of Lock Haven wrestling lives on through the endowed **Mike Nauman ‘80 Men’s Wrestling Scholarship**, providing immediate and lasting assistance for Lock Haven wrestlers in support of The Rise campaign.

JIM SCHUSTER ‘76

A Legacy Secured In Perpetuity

Record-breaking Lock Haven wrestler and Hall of Fame inductee, **Jim Schuster ‘76**, and his wife Ann Marie established the **James Schuster ‘76 Wrestling Scholarship** through The Rise campaign. Ralph '64 and Linda Lehman '61: A Legacy of Creative, Purposeful Giving

For more than two decades, Ralph and Linda Lehman demonstrated how thoughtful planning can amplify philanthropic impact at Commonwealth University-Lock Haven. Before Ralph's passing in 2022, the Lehmans established a six-figure life insurance policy naming the LHU Foundation as beneficiary—a planned gift that upon Linda's passing will provide transformational support to the University.

Linda continues to create immediate impact through her annual Required Minimum Distribution (RMD), which she uses each year to fund the **Ralph and Linda Lehman Family Scholarship** for exemplary Jersey Shore High School graduates who continue their education at The Haven. This "in-and-out" scholarship allows her to see the impact of her giving in real time while also avoiding taxable income on her RMD.

Upon Linda's passing, the life insurance proceeds will be directed to strategic priorities within the College of Education, such as brick-and-mortar enhancements, program development, or faculty support. A portion of the Lehmans' estate gift will also be used to endow a men's soccer scholarship, with Linda retaining the option to use her RMD to early activate that scholarship to see its immediate impact.

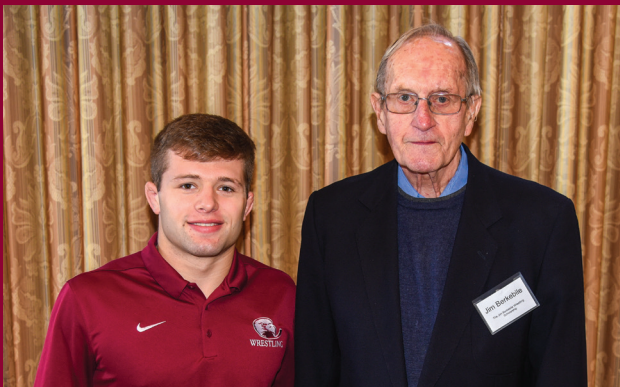

Dr. Karl Hartsock '73, (VMD) Invests in Future Biologists

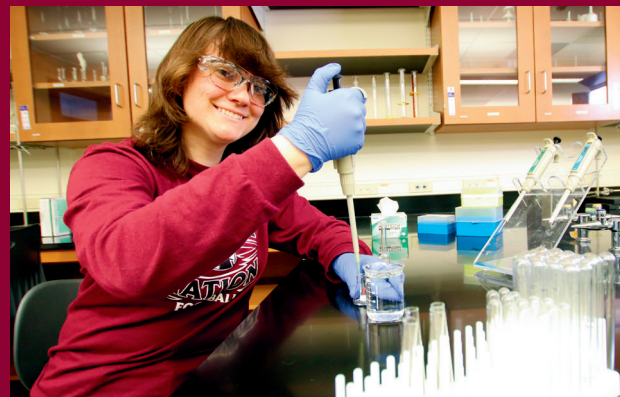
In celebration of the Lock Haven education that helped launch his career in veterinary medicine, **Dr. Karl Hartsock '73 (VMD)** established the **Karl Hartsock, VMD Scholarship** through a major gift from his Required Minimum Distribution (RMD). This endowed gift includes \$1,000 in immediate-use funds to early activate the scholarship so it can be awarded during the 2025-'26 school year. Dr. Hartsock's generosity will aid admissions in its recruitment of biology majors, while helping future Bald Eagles pursue scientific study and academic success.
