Associate of Science in Nursing (ASN)

This degree map is based on the 2024-25 Academic Catalog and is subject to change. Students should meet with their academic advisor each semester and use Degree Works to monitor their individual progress toward degree completion. The time it takes to earn a degree will vary based on several factors including summer/winter enrollment, dual enrollment and number of courses successfully completed each semester. We recommend taking a minimum of 15 credits each fall and spring semester.

Degree Requirements

All students must obtain a minimum of 60 credits, complete all General Education requirements, and all requirements for the selected major. Meet with your advisor and consult Degree Works to monitor your progress and for all graduation requirements.

A minimum GPA of 2.7 and a grade of “C” or higher in Nursing Courses to progress in the ASN Program is required. Along with a “C” or higher in the Sciences: Human Anatomy and Physiology I and Human Anatomy and Physiology II is required.
