

Degree Works for Students

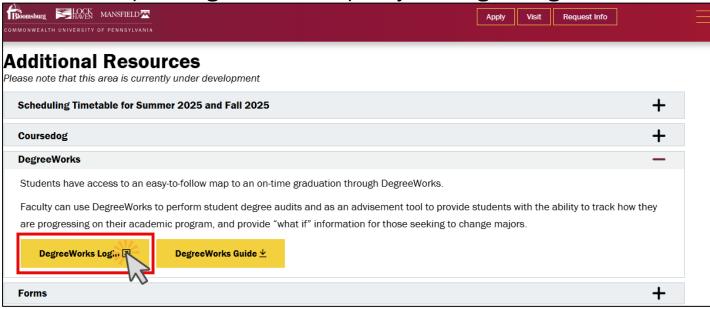
Degree Works is a tool that creates an easy-to-follow map to an on-time graduation. It lets you track your progress toward your degree at Commonwealth University.

You and your advisor have access to Degree Works to help create your educational plan. **Degree Works allows you to track your degree requirements for graduation with a degree worksheet.** Your worksheet shows every requirement for general education and your major(s) and minor(s), and your progress toward completion and your degree from Commonwealth University of Pennsylvania.

You should use your worksheet when selecting courses for the upcoming term and to plan your long-term graduation

plan.

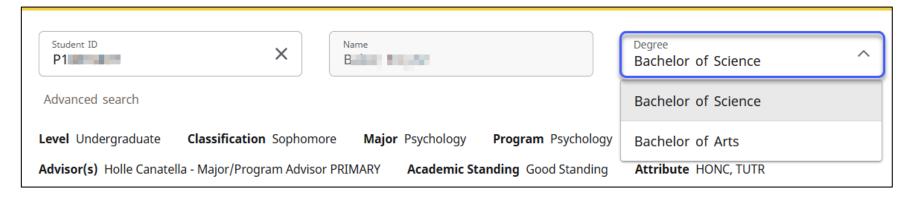

Your worksheet is made up of several blocks of information about you and your academic progress.

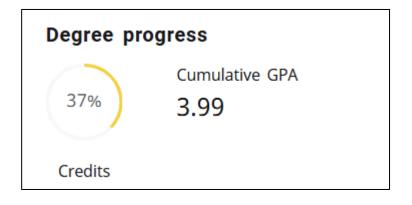
At the top of the worksheet, you will see the **Student Card**. This part of the worksheet provides an overall summary of your personal academic information including your level, classification, major(s), program, campus, advisor(s), and academic standing. If applicable, you will also see your minor(s) and concentration(s).



Pictured at left: The Student Card portion of your worksheet provides a summary about you. If you are seeking multiple degrees, they will be audited separately. Change the degree in the right-most dropdown to select the audit for each degree.

Degree Progress

The degree progress section of the audit provides a credit spinner of your progress toward a degree and shows your current cumulative grade point average. The credit spinner includes earned and inprogress credits, but it excludes credits not needed for your degree. In other words, if you have excess electives, they are not included in the credit spinner.



Degree Block

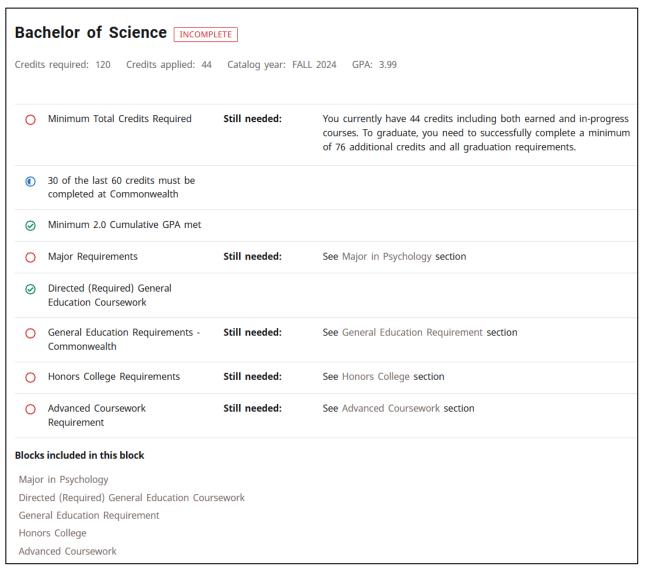
The Degree Block provides a summary of your graduation requirements. Each requirement listed will have more detailed information further down on the worksheet.

There are several other marks you may see on your worksheet. There is a complete legend on the next page for your reference. It is available at the very bottom of your worksheet in Degree Works as well.

Degree Works Worksheet Legend

All your requirements will show a progress icon on your worksheet. These icons are shown at the very bottom of your worksheet in a legend so you understand what they each mean. Here is that legend for your quick reference:



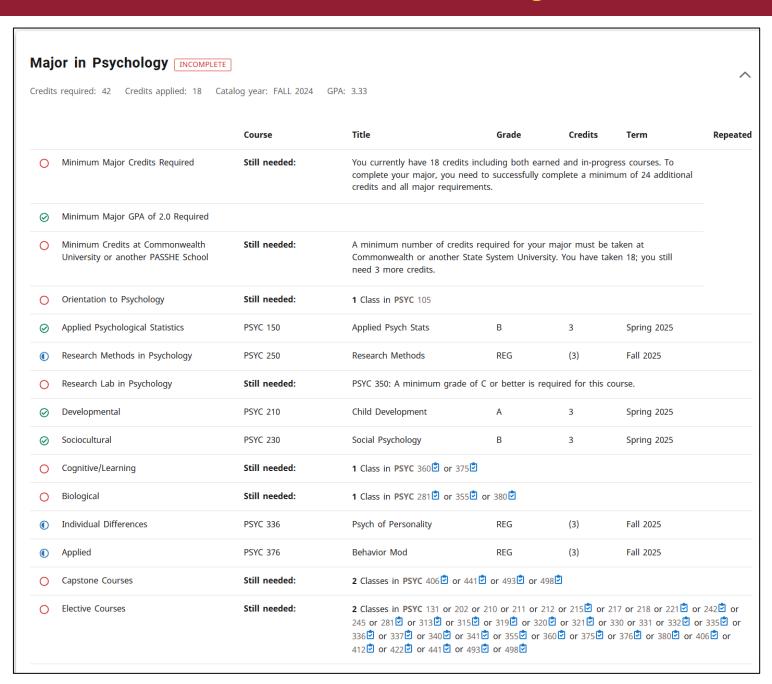
There is *also* a disclaimer that advises students and advisors to use Degree Works as a tool and not the authority on a student's progress, and that Degree Works assumes successful completion of in-progress courses so students and advisors should always check completion requirements carefully.

Reading Your Worksheet Major Block

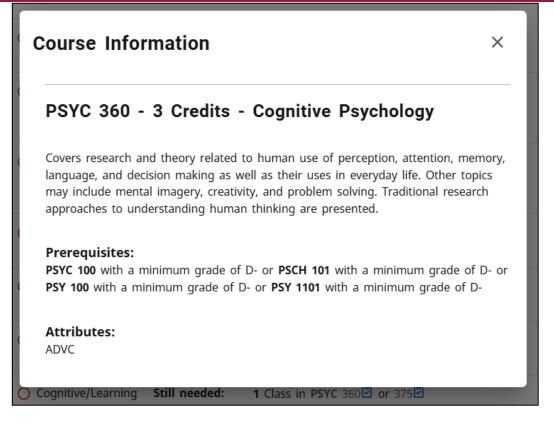
The major block details your major requirements and, if applicable, your concentration requirements.

In the example to the right, you can see different requirements have different progress icons, including some that are currently in-progress. This view will vary student by student as it is real-time completion information about your progress toward degree completion.

Degree Works displays the grade that was received for each requirement, the credits associated with that requirement, and the term in which the requirement was completed.



For requirements that have not been completed yet, clicking on the course will display a detailed description of the requirement. Clicking on PSYC 360 will display this detailed description:

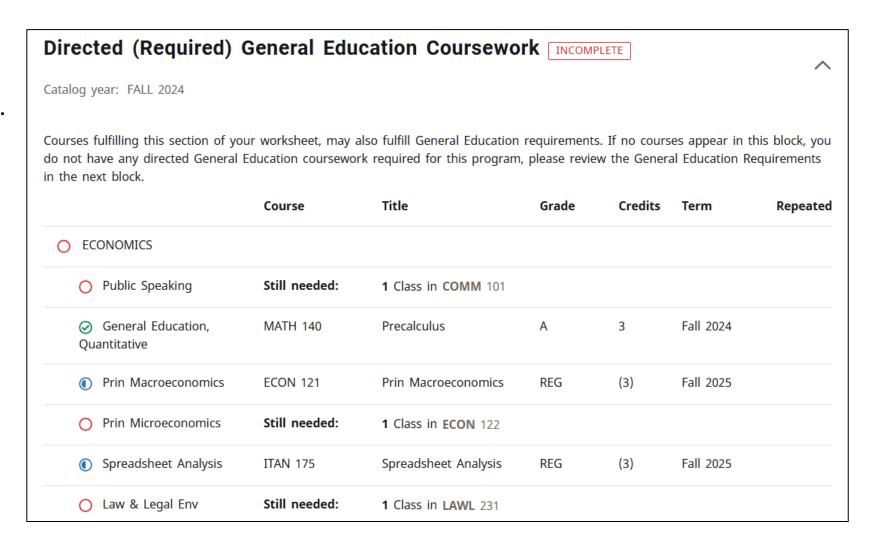


The title and credit hours for the course are displayed, followed by the full course description, followed by any prerequisites associated with the course, followed by attributes assigned to the course, and, if the course is being offered, the dates and times of the section(s).

Clicking on a range of courses, such as PSYC 300:399, will pull this detailed description for any courses that fit within that range or have the associated attribute. This can be particularly helpful if there are a number of electives that can meet a requirement and a student wants to explore all of the options available to them.

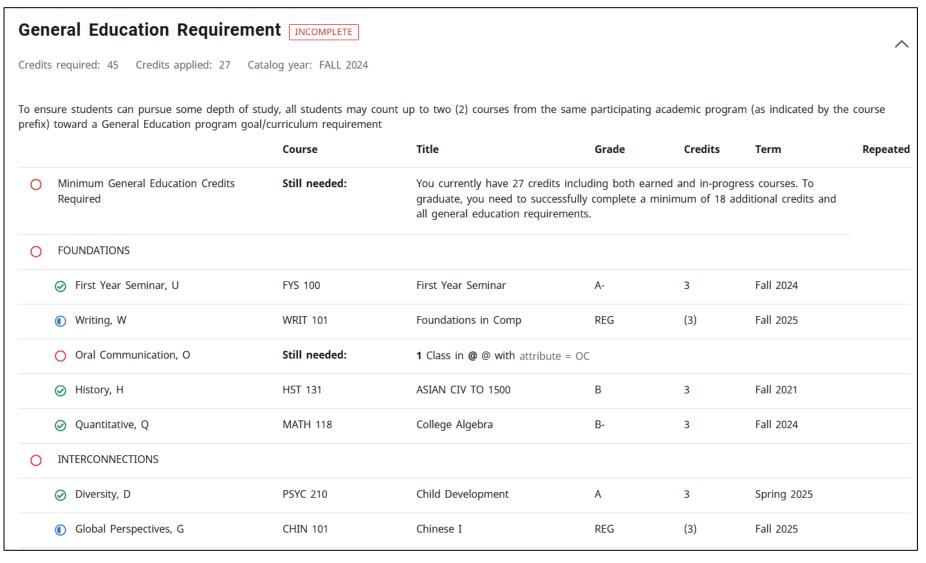
General Education Required Courses

If your major requires you to complete specific courses in general education, you may see this section on your audit. It lists courses that must be completed for your major in addition to your general education requirements. Typically, the courses in this section of your worksheet will also fulfill coursework in your general education block.



General Education Block

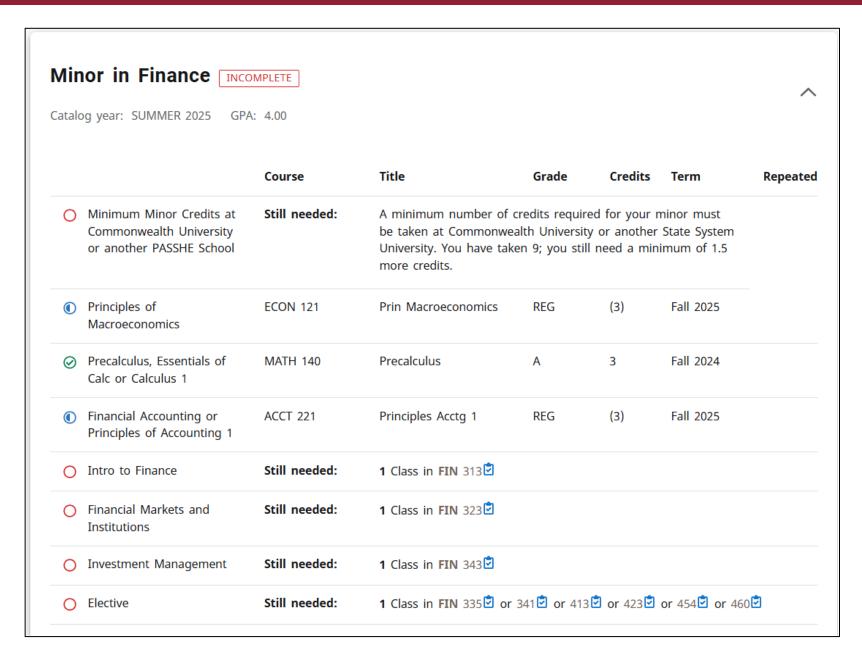
The general education block shows you the General Education Core requirements that you need to fulfill based on your catalog.



Reading Your Worksheet Minor Block

If a student has a minor, or multiple minors, the Minor Block will appear independent of their Major Block.

Depending on your program of study, courses may be shared between the major and minor, so if a course was a requirement for a major, it can still be used here to complete a requirement for a minor.



Free Electives Block

Free electives are courses that can count toward your overall credit total or residency requirement but are not used elsewhere on the worksheet.

Not Eligible. Includes Withdraw, Failed, Repeated, and Minimum Grade not Met

This section of the audit lists courses where you did not earn a grade that can be used to meet a requirement. It includes courses where you did not earn credit.

Not Counted

The Not Counted section of the audit includes classes that cannot be used to complete degree requirements. It will include ungraded lab sections and remedial coursework. Each course will have a reason explaining why it cannot be used to complete degree requirements.

In-Progress or In-Progress and Pre-registered

In addition to displaying where they fit on the worksheet, this section of the audit lists your in-progress and preregistered coursework.

Exceptions

Any exceptions to the published degree requirements are listed here at the bottom of the worksheet. They are also displayed where they fit within the worksheet.

Degree Works Tools

Hover Hints

When a course is listed as still needed, hover over the subject and number to see the course title and credits.





Printer Icon

Click to export a .pdf file of the worksheet for saving or printing.

Envelope Icon

Click to see the contact information for the student and their advisors.

Course History

Click the three dots then Course History to display all of the courses a student has taken in chronological order.

GPA Estimator

Click the three dots then GPA Estimator to display three separate calculators:

- Graduation Calculator
- Semester Calculator
- Advice Calculator
