I. Call to Order, 3:02 PM

III. Announcements, Issues, and Updates

A. Presidential Search (D. Knorr):

- i. There will be a campus-wide email with details of the search. The committee met this morning to finalize the timeline. Website link for Presidential Search page, contact info, link to working draft of the leadership profile of what we are looking for. There will be a feedback form for that. Single candidate search to begin with, but the leadership profile is being developed aside from Jeff's candidacy. There will be a full day of campus interviews with Jeff on each campus. Wed. Feb. 18 at Mansfield. At the end of this process, the search committee will report to the Board of Trustees if they want to keep Jeff or open up a national search. The plan is to make that recommendation in time for the March 6 Board of Trustees meeting. The system gave us a waiver to do the single candidate process first.

B. Senate Constitution Amendments (M. Decker):

- i. Several constitutional amendments are being proposed, they should be up on the Share Point for comment soon.

C. Facilities Progress (S. Wagner)

- i. North Hall: insurance denied the roof proposal, came back with an insurance settlement claim of ~\$235k, as opposed to the estimate of almost \$3 mill. Brought in four more companies, only one bid, still over \$2 million. Further meeting with PASSHE, the roofing companies, insurance company, etc. The insurance company did not include any scaffolding cost, which is approximately half of the cost. They made a compromise proposal, and the company made another proposal, \$592k. There is another meeting tomorrow morning with insurance to try to come to an agreement. This is still just the emergency repairs from last year. We still need a new roof and other repairs, totaling about \$8 million.

- A. Wouldn't architectural shingles be cheaper? No, because the main cost is the scaffolding, which would have to be done more often for shingles than the slate

- B. Are we applying for grants for historical buildings?
 - C. Is there a campaign to try to preserve North Hall? Not currently. The Foundation does not decide what the priorities should be for a capital campaign, that comes from the administration.
 - D. We are in the process of identifying funding to begin the process of a facilities master plan.
- ii. Lower Manser: there are lots of ideas for Lower. An ad hoc subgroup of the Space & Facilities committee is working on this. The external work is almost complete, but there have been issues with customs, etc. The elevator lobby is the only piece still incomplete, which is being held up by supply chain issues.
- iii. Facilities Fees: they stopped charging for academic use of vehicles. They are collecting data on space usage for external and co-sponsored events. Once they know how much it costs, they can work with administration to figure out appropriate use of our facilities. For the first five months, these events cost about \$100k, which is currently being covered by the Facilities budget
- iv. Stadium renovation: it is going nowhere right now with the budget issues. There is a potential donor, but the timing of that is not feasible for the renovation at this time.

 - i. Enrollment Management Subcommittee (C. Lapos, J. White):
 - A. Met several times in fall to incorporate feedback on the transfer policy, which has now been approved.
 - B. Recognize the work of Heidi Warmer and Deborah Thomas that was put into implementing Course Dog
 - C. Transfer applications are up, deposits are running even. For first years, we’re trending down in applications and deposits. Applications are down 95, deposits are down 45. We have a brand new hire in MU admissions, who just graduated from here in Dec., from the Southern Tier, hoping she can help us turn it around. Increasing major showcase days and targeting key high

schools, teachers, principals for increasing student participation in major showcase days. Partnering with athletics to drive enrollment. Increasing social media presence. Every major showcase day will have a photographer. They've revamped the tour guide program, hired 6 new students, updated tour route, etc. Accepted students day April 11, Open House March 2. Admissions has moved to the third floor of Alumni.

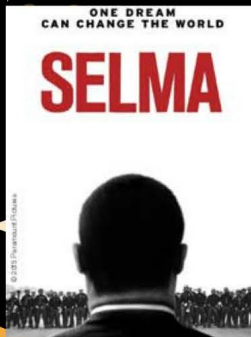
